Kerobe news

The school has had an increase in students and needed to build temporary classrooms in order to accommodate all the children. These classrooms are made of iron sheets and will be very hot in summer and are not water proof in the rainy seasons. The school is also wanting funds to plant crops, like corn, to provide food that is used to feed the children – right hand photo of the school's farm land. "The temporary classrooms have enabled us to operate, but we don't want to rely on them for too long as they are not a positive learning environment for the children" says Sammy Barongo, Director Kerobe Joy Bright Academy



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
