4. Annual report

- CEO Simon Carroll provided a summary of the Annual Report and some background information of the happenings in 2020/21:
- 2020 was a tough year due to COVID in Kenya other challenges made it even harder:
 - Food shortage and rising cost of food in early 2020 floods, locust swarms
 - Schools closed April Dec 2020 due to COVID
 - Various COVID restrictions applied to people in Kenya
 - Health system struggled to cope
 - Limited contact with GSP Australian Schools, due to COVID situation.
- Full members of ACFID & signatory to code of conduct achieved Major milestone for GSP

- 10th anniversary in 2020 unfortunately couldn't celebrate due to COVID restrictions meaning no major events were possible
- Strong financial performance- revenue up 11% on previous year
 - 25% of sponsors withdrew support due to COVID economic impact
 - Several different fundraisers used by GSP such as online raffle
 - Australian expenses <4% this money was spent on ACFID membership, accounting, eTapestry CRM, bank fees
 - Conscia Pty Ltd Partnership is a highlight 24 children in Kenya provided with scholarships, one for each staff member at Conscia Pty Ltd
- Activity in Kenya
 - Kenya schools received funds to subsidise teachers' pay while schools closed
 - Early 2021 recommenced YWP, First aid and Treatment Programs
 - Some individual donors provided funds to facilitate these Programs
 - Fewer school projects due to schools being closed
 - Some projects started in 2021, most completed or ongoing at EOFY
- Overview of Programs & Impacts
 - YWP reduces absenteeism of female students by 88%
 - Environmental sustainability of YWP demonstrated through partnerships with Kenyan supplier Rentokil Initial
 - First aid full kits provided to each school, including COVID compliant requirements – training of Health Officers ongoing
 - Health clinic partnerships initiated
 - New Textbooks Program, supply of 5,620 textbooks funded for 2021/22 FY.
- Update on Schools
 - COVID economic effect resulted in the closure of two GSP-KC schools – School of Hope & Joe Maths Academy
 - School of Hope Purchased by Surgeon Academy so infrastructure retained in GSP-KC
 - New growth in 2021 of students and schools.
- Looking ahead
 - Application with DFAT for accreditation in ANCP
 - Fundraisers 3 upcoming events planned
 - Partnering models with businesses to increase impact.

5. Financial report

- Strong year with revenue of \$184,970
- Of which \$177,508 went to Kenya
- Australian expenses <4% this money was spent on ACFID membership, accounting, eTapestry CRM, bank fees
- Small amount of funds retained \$896
- Audited ACFID compliant financial statements produced
- Profit/Loss statement presented
- Balance sheet presented

- Both Karen Achurch and Paul McGinness stood for re-election.
