What's happening at your school

Alimo Academy has added grade 9 and is now classified as a Junior Secondary School. This has been positively accepted in the community and their student numbers are well over 1,000.

The change to Junior Secondary status means that they now have to establish a science laboratory, further develop their computer capabilties, and provide boarding facilities for boys.

Alimo Academy has a large number of students from low socio-economic backgrounds who are needing <u>sponsorship</u> to enable them to stay in school.
