Money for food for scholarship students at Precious Talent

After floods, locust plagues, drought and now COVID-19 a famine is looming in East Africa, including Kenya, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Somalia.

Lonah Maiko, our GSP Program Officer, says that although the Precious Talent community hasn't reported many cases, every family has been particularly struggling to afford food due to the shortages and increased prices.

GSP scholarship student's families recently received money for food – a huge thank you to our sponsor families who are helping these families through this very difficult time.







Without students, and school fees, Precious Talent has faced a huge challenge just to survive in 2020

Schools in Kenya have been closed since March, with several proposed dates for re-opening having come and gone. Now schools are to re-open in January 2021 with all students repeating the entire year. When schools re-open they must provide wand washing with soap, sanitiser, face masks and enough desks to enable physical distancing between students.

Our estimate is that on average GSP schools in Kenya will need approximately **\$1,500** worth of PPE just to be allowed to re-open. Precious Talent are looking at more water tanks, hand-washing stations, more desks, soap, sanitisers and face masks in order to reopen.
